

Ask science? Part 2

Things to ponder

First, some say “*Christian belief is a delusion.*”

Isn't that really wishful thinking? It may be saying what one hopes is true, but that's not very scientific.

If God is clearly at work in our world, blessing those countries where he is honoured and recognised, then that's no delusion.

Remember God's promise: “Those who honour me I will honour, and those who despise me shall be lightly esteemed.” 1 Samuel 2.30.

God's overwhelming influence in our world's affairs is hard to ignore. Just read your newspaper, or watch the television news.

Second, some say, “*God's reality can't be proved scientifically*”, but that's not true either!

We have important scientific proof of God's reality - the kind of proof used daily by magistrates in our law courts. To reach a decision on evidence that is placed before them, they make their findings on the basis of *proof beyond reasonable doubt*.

Third, some say, “*If Christianity is true, why is it opposed by scientists?*”

Why is it *not* opposed by many other scientists? It's because each person is free to make up his own mind. We pray that those in error will find the truth.
